

**Lt Col Kenneth Garside (1913-1983)**

## 1st Accession

The following collection was given to the Liddell Hart Centre for Military Archives by the Librarian of Kings College, Lieutenant Colonel Kenneth Garside on 30 August 1974. Colonel Garside had worked in Intelligence in Germany at the end of the war as GSO 2 (Int) at HQ 21 Army Group.

## 2nd & 3rd Accessions

Papers given to the Liddell Hart Centre for Military Archives by Lt-Col Kenneth Garside on 5 December 1978. Col Garside had previously given some papers now placed at Garside 1st acc, but this accession is unconnected with the papers of the first accession. It comprises 3 files of the Enemy Publications (Requirements) Committee 1945-48. EPCOM as it was known, was set up in 1945 to ensure that German learned publications of the war years could be made available to British university and other research libraries. It was serviced by the Control Office for Germany at Norfolk House in St James's Square, though originally from Lansdowne House in Berkley Square. These files are probably the most complete extant apart from the official files which are presumably now at the Public Record Office.
