Papers of Patrick VWRH O'Regan (1920-1961)

Patrick Valentine William Rowan Hamilton O'Regan was born on 2 February 1920. He attended Marlborough College, where his father had been a Master from 1894 until his death in 1922. In 1940 he enlisted into the RAMC, serving with the 186th Field Ambulance Service in the Middle East. He then joined the Intelligence Corps and later SOE, leading to his service in No 1 Special Force with the partisans in Italy in 1944, for which he was awarded the MC and Bar. He died in Paris on 8 March 1961.

The papers listed below comprise the second and third accessions only, and include letters written by O'Regan to his mother, initially while a member of the 186th Field Ambulance Service based in England and later from the Middle East as a member of the Intelligence Corps, GHQ and the Political Warfare Executive (PWE) Military Training School. Letters dated 1945 are sent from Camp B6, Force 136, Ceylon.
