Commendation from the War Office, confirming that Capt. and Bt.-Maj. [Brevet Major] E.L. Spiers [Spears], M.C. was mentioned in a Dispatch from Field Marshal Sir Douglas Haig on the 9th April 1917. Signed by Winston S. Churchill, Secretary of State for War.

SPEARS: 12/11 1919 Apr 18

Commendation mounted on card, from General Pechitch, Chief of the Delegation of the Kingdom of the Serbs, Croats, and Slovenes at the Paris Peace Conference, informing Spears that he has been awarded the Grand Officer's Cross of the Order of the White Eagle (with swords), a Royal Order of the Kingdom of Serbia. Language: French.

SPEARS: 12/12 1919 Jun 23

Commendation mounted on card, from the Romanian Minister of War, informing Spears that he has been brevetted Commander Brigadier General. Language: Romanian.

SPEARS: 12/13 1920 Jan 27

Commendation mounted on card, addressed to Spiers [Spears], signed by General Józef Haller. Language: Polish.

SPEARS: 12/14 1920 Oct 1

Commendation mounted on card, from the French Ministry of War, approved by President P[aul] Deschanel and Prime Minister A[lexandre] Millerand, confirming that Spears has been awarded the rank of Commander. Language: French.

SPEARS: 12/15 N.D.

Commendation mounted on card, from the French Ministry of War, addressed to Lt. Colonel Spiers [Spears]. It grants Spears the right to wear a ribbon with a red enamel star, a special insignia for those injured in the war against Germany and her Allies. Language: French.

SPEARS: 12/16 N.D.

Message from the Minister of War, Czechoslovakia, informing Spears that the Government of the Republic of Czechoslovakia wishes to confer on him a military cross ("la Croix de Guerre Tchécoslovaque"). Signed Edvard Beneš, Minister of Foreign Affairs. Language: French.
